



SOUND OF FINGAL'S CAVE MELLIFLUOUS

The most famous spot on Staffa is Fingal's Cave, named after the legendary giant, Fingal, who features in ancient Irish sagas.

Legend has it that he built a crossing, the socalled Giant's Causeway, between Scotland and Ireland. The spectacular landscapes of the Hebrides inspired Mendelssohn to write his famous overture The Hebrides, often known as Fingal's Cave. In the native Gaelic, the cave is known as An Uaimh Bhinn, which translates as 'the melodious cave'.

Sir Walter Scott wrote that Fingal's Cave was 'one of the most remarkable places I ever had the honor to behold'. The vast space of the cave's interior repeatedly echoes with the wash of the surf, so that it seems the entire cave is singing.
